

Every school must have special educator: CBSE

While most schools in city have expert member to assist students with learning disabilities, others have made appointments this academic yr; principals press with need for the same

According to a Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) order issued last week, all schools are required to appoint one special educator to assist students with varied learning disabilities. This directive comes at a time when even the Bombay High Court has ordered the government to have one special-needs testing centre in each district.

However, as CBSE's instructions seem to be a step ahead, schools in the city are now hurrying to appoint them on a full-time basis to work with children, who need additional support.

D T Sudarshan Rao, joint secretary (academics and training), CBSE, stated in the order, "These teachers may work with children with physical disabilities, sensory impairments, developmental disabilities such as

autism, cerebral palsy and specific learning disabilities. Such kids are emotionally vulnerable and have behavioural difficulties. A special educator can also work with gifted and talented children."

A lot of CBSE schools in the city have special educators on board, but the other have begun appointing from this academic year. Vinita Khadkar, principal of City International School at Wanowrie, said, "We used to receive assistance from organisations working for a similar cause. However, we have appointed a full-time teacher from this year as there is a need. But, we'll continue to partner with those organisations as one teacher cannot possibly have an all-round expertise."

Laxmi Kumar, director of Orchid School, who already has appointed three special educators and also has something called a recourse room, meant for students with special needs, said, "We have always had a special educator. The numbers have increased with time and demand. Such teachers help students with learning disabilities cope up with mainstream studies. More importantly, they are required as shadow teachers when the regular teachers take classes. They also guide parents of such students and help in planning out study patterns at home."


Madhavi C V, principal of DAV School in Aundh, too, pressed with the need. "When talking about inclusive education, special educators are highly needed as such students need specific assistance to move forward successfully."

The school also received the silver trophy for 'Runner up champions'. It was a truly memorable experience for all the participants.


